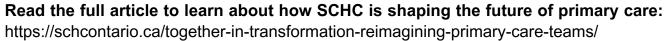

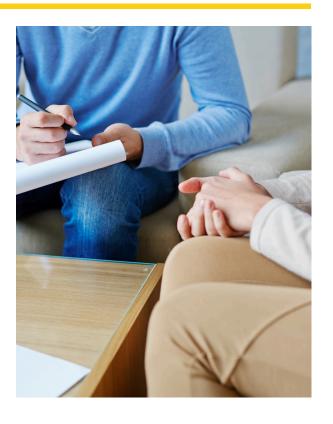
COMPASSIONATE 1:1 BEREAVEMENT COUNSELLING AVAILABLE

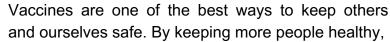

WHY IS FALL "VACCINE SEASON"?

Each year, as temperature drops, respiratory illnesses such as influenza, COVID-19, and RSV (Respiratory Syncytial Virus) begin to rise. As people spend more time indoors, these viruses spread more readily, placing added demands on Ontario's health system.





vaccines help reduce the number of hospital visits, ease the burden on emergency rooms, and support schools and workplaces to run smoothly with fewer disruptions.

The fall season also coincides with the return to school and work routines, making it a timely reminder for families to ensure their vaccinations are up to date. This may include getting a flu shot or a COVID-19 booster at your local pharmacy or community clinic, as well as RSV protection for those most at risk, including everyone aged 75 and older.

As the crisp air of fall settles in and the season of giving begins, SCHC is proud to celebrate the success of our month-long Board of Directors Food Fight campaign, which ran from June 21st to July 24th. This initiative brought together the compassion and generosity of our community, resulting in over 30 important and generous donations. Together, we exceeded our fundraising goal by raising \$8,738 and collecting 367 lbs of non-perishable food, enough to provide over 4.000 balanced meals to individuals Scarborough. Our food bank currently feeds over 600 families every week, and with food insecurity growing at an alarming rate, this crisis is becoming an epidemic. Your support is not just appreciated, it is essential.



Our Board of Directors led the charge, inspiring donors to come forward and support our food bank through online contributions and personal food drives. Their leadership reminded us of all that caring for one another is the true spirit of the season. The impact was deeply felt by our clients within the community, who shared heartfelt messages like: "Thank you so much for giving us the food... we very much appreciate it from the bottom of our hearts." and "Thank you donors for your service and generosity."
